9:23	Faith Promises Explanation: Hazel Cramer Good Morning. I'm Hazel Cramer, a longtime member of our church's Missions committee. You can probably tell by seeing a lot of the same faces year after year why we like to joke that the only way to get off this committee is to move away or die! I'm never going to move again – if I can help it – so I'll have to wait for the alternative. I know that most of you are familiar with the words "Faith Promise giving." It is the process that has been used by this church for many, many years because we know that God will bless any church that takes seriously the mandate of the Great Commission. It is an agreement between you and God promising a certain amount for Missions. It's not a part of the tithe you give to the church, but money miraculously provide by God to enable you to support our missionaries; aside from the amount one provides for weekly or monthly giving to the church. Since I retired in 1992 – at the age of 37- I had a health pension provided by investments in the stock market. But like a lot of you, the bottom fell out of my world in the year just ended. After the initial shock work off, I had to decide what could stay and what could go. My first thought was not "I'll opt out of my Missions commitment because the church won't send me over due notices." Instead, I tried to keep things as near normal as possible and cut back a little on everything. And somehow God provided money and allowed me to continue to support missions and the church. Today, Faith Promises are even more important because of the incredible demands on our missionaries, beginning, of course, with teaching the word of God, but continuing now with care for the elderly and disabled, for widows and children, and for establishing the health and agricultural structures that will allow the poor and suffering to be independent and free.	

	In these times and with these needs, won't you have a quiet talk with God and consider how you can give to missions. Perhaps the Lord will direct you to give your time or your labor or your commitment of prayer to the work of the Great Commission or to give a part of the financial resources He has first given us. What will he ask you to do and enable you to do? God is a great provider, so let Him give you your decision. "...along unfamiliar paths, I will guide them; I will turn darkness into light before them And make the rough places smooth. These are the things I will do..." (Isaiah 42:16)
