### JOY's Newest Missionaries! Hal & Sue Hoege

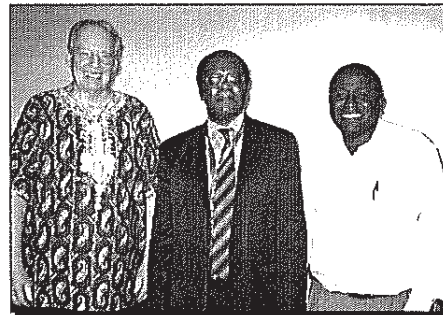

### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

## What's the Latest with the Radio Station?

#### Q. What's the latest news with the radio station?

A. We have been told by the Tanzania government that with our presentation to the top regulators in Dar es Salaam, our application is now complete. It will go to a management committee, then the Board of Regulators, then to the Minister of Communications. So we must wait for all this to happen — perhaps three months.

The station construction is finished at the JOY headquarters site where our studio is located. We still have to build the hilltop transmitting site, but have been advised to wait for our construction permit from the government before starting it.

We are hard at work acquiring music and programs for the station's digital library.

Dear Friends,

The labeling of Africa as “the Dark Continent” goes back to the book written in 1878 by Henry Stanley (the man who found David Livingstone) entitled *Through the Dark Continent*. The term had nothing to do with the color of the people living there, nor their so-called primitive ways. So little was known about the interior of Africa, early mapmakers would leave large areas of their maps dark. Dark meant unknown.

Flying over Africa as a bush pilot, the aviation maps I used had large white areas where the terrain data was unknown. One hundred years after Stanley, much about Africa was still unknown and wild. If Stanley had used my aviation maps, his book might have been entitled, *Through the White Continent*.

The first map to show the very rough shape of the African continent was drawn in 1554. Within thirty years they had gotten the outline of the continent correct. Yet three hundred years later the interior was largely unexplored. Maps of the mid- 1800's had dark stretches across the African continent to acknowledge the mapmakers' ignorance.

Maps are tools that help people define and navigate their way through the world. Maps are only as good as the truthfulness of their information. The fiasco with Apple maps giving false information and directions is a recent example of “maps gone bad”.

In some sense, the Bible is a map from God to help people navigate life. For thousands of years its truth has guided, informed, and instructed. The Bible speaks truth to every generation and every person. The excellence of this “roadmap for life” points us to the Only One who can show us the way.

As a student pilot, on my first solo cross-country flight, I accidentally flew off the edge of my aviation map. Lost, scared, without hope of finding my own way, only the guidance of an air traffic controller got me to the runway. As Christians we know that the Master Controller is on full alert for those who are struggling to find their way. Perhaps they are following inferior “life maps”, or perhaps just their inattention has brought them to the wrong place in life. His help is always just a call away.
