This is a challenge for me because I have an active lifestyle. Bible studies, shopping for home, church work and services, errands associated with Little Dresses, and get-togethers with best friends all came to a halt or had to be changed drastically.

During the first 40 days, we had a lot of time to bond. The Lord placed in Pat's heart to switch from her "Little Dresses" ministry to making masks. Others who helped sew little dresses also switched to making masks. Early on, Pat and I decided to switch roles. She sewed masks and I managed the house. It is like God knew that I would serve my apprenticeship while she had back problems for the past year. My real test has been in the last four weeks. Now I have favorite recipes, ways of doing laundry, and developed methods of housekeeping. My friends, Ed and Janet DelLongo, and my kids, Jim and Mellissa, have been my eyes and ears in the grocery store, Amazon, and other shopping outlets. We are thankful for them.

The greatest thing that occurred during the COVID-19 pandemic was our 45th wedding anniversary on April 17th. It fell on Easter Sunday, April 12th. How novel! There was no big splash of cards, flowers or chocolate, but "Good morning. I love you. We will make this up later." But wait?

Another great thing during this time was that my dear love, Pat, stayed home. She did not have to, because I am the one with health risks. Before writing this article, I did not realize how fortunate I am to have a lovely wife stay home so she would not put me at risk. I realize that God had a big hand in this. He is the great social manager of all. How fortunate I am in all respects.

Little Dresses Ministry

It is always a pleasure to talk to you about "Little Dresses." As you know, our ministry sews dresses for little girls in third world countries. Girls are the least valued of God's children – the least of the least.

I call these pictures the "visible fruit" of this sewing ministry. The pictures are from a seminary in Venezuela. That country is in turmoil. The people are suffering. We see no smiles on these girl's faces. The missionaries risked their lives to bring a little Christmas joy to these girls.

Little dresses were also sent to Tanzania, the Philippines, Mexico, the Ivory Coast, Indonesia and our more recent country, Cambodia. Kathy Cheong, Esther Yoon's sister, learned to sew with us two years ago. Kathy is a pastor's wife in South Korea and started their sewing ministry with rented sewing machines from the library. Last month their church sent 70 dresses to Cambodia. God's power at work and we are so grateful to count them sister's in mission.

We now have 17 members of Faith Church involved in this ministry. And we have 17 community volunteers who have

come to sew and be a vital part of "Little Dresses." Our total dress count since November 1, 2017, is 2,018 dresses. We have sent to 14 countries. We are growing. We occupy 4-1/2 rooms and have 9 sewing machines in the sewing rooms.

We continue to fellowship and have made new friends. We are sisters in friendship and purpose. Our dresses are sewn with love and sprinkled with prayers. Every dress is prayed over before it is sent on its way. Thank you for your prayers and support. I hope you will come see what we do. Just let me know and I'll give you a grand tour.

So, let us end with prayer: Dear Lord, thank you for all your blessings, especially the blessings we take for granted. Thank you for touching so many hearts to serve in this ministry of hope for little girls. We ask you to continue to bless us as we go forward for Your Honor and Your Glory. In Jesus' name we pray. And all God's people would say – Amen.

Children and Youth Ministry

Quarantine News:

- -I have sent out Bible readings for the children and youth. If you or your child has not received this, please email or text me, and I will send it to you.
- -The children's Sunday School packet has the curriculum that the teachers use and my notes. Parents, please go through the packet with your children, especially if they cannot read and/or understand the curriculum. And please make sure that they read the Bible verses for each week. If they have any questions, I have asked them to write them down so that they can bring them to me.
- -The youth's Quiet Time booklet has our planned Bible readings with my notes and questions. Quiet Time is a Christian meditative practice where one spends time quietly while reflecting on the Bible. If the youth have any questions, they are encouraged to write down their thoughts to bring to me and the group.
- -Both the children and the youth meet with me on Zoom every week for about 30 minutes, an hour at most. We check-in, discuss the Bible reading, do announcements, and end in prayer. The days and times we meet have changed a number of times. So if you want to join the Zoom meeting, please send me an email or text, and I'll send you the Zoom invite.

Cancelled Events:

- -Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the shelter-in-place order, we had to cancel any events during the second half of March and all of April. We also have to cancel future events that cannot happen because of quarantine.
- -Breakfast with Bunny and Ice Skating were cancelled; however, I will see if I can reschedule our ice skating event for a later date. It may not be right away, as the pandemic may still be a danger even after the shelter-in-place order is lifted.
- -VBS is also cancelled because it is not possible to plan for the event during this time.

Future Events:

- -We are unsure if the shelter-in-place order will continue into June, but hoping that the order will end on May 30th, I have listed future events we can do in June and the rest of summer.
- -As VBS is cancelled, we have decided that we will instead come up with more event days during the summer. These events are still in the works, as I am not sure what is available yet, but there are cancelled events that we can reschedule for this time.
- -Art Day Originally scheduled for April, the kids and I will spend some time on a Sunday creating something new to decorate the halls of our church. I already have an idea for what we will do, thanks to Rose and Terry Paulhus, but that will be a surprise. While I hadn't planned this originally, I may try to see if we could do an art day with the youth as well.

- -Movie Day We had a movie day in February, and it was very fun. I would like to do another movie day, but due to the technical difficulties, I will try to see if we can do it somewhere else in the church, even if it means meeting on a Saturday. Like last time, everyone is invited, but the youth will be required to discuss the movie together.
- -Other events will be planned as soon as I can gauge what is available and what everyone wants to do. Going to the zoo or the aquarium are possible events, but I'm not sure if they can happen in June since the virus may still be a danger.
- -Graduation Celebration Originally, this was planned on May 24th. I will be discussing with Pastor about this to see if we should postpone this until we meet or if we could do something online.

Update from Oasis

Dear Friends, April 15, 2020

Before sharing our news, we want to acknowledge the challenging times so many of you are facing right now. In the wake of Covid-19, some of you may be afraid for your jobs, your savings, or worried for your health or your loved ones. Those of you who work in medical care are in a unique position of service and stress right now; we are upholding you in prayer! Throughout the years, your prayers have sustained us through different challenges, and we want to stand with you as well. We are praying for you, that God's peace will guard your hearts and minds in the love of Jesus and that He will care for you generously in this time. Please let us know any specific needs that we can be praying for on your behalf!

Covid-19 has also reached our area of service and will likely have a devastating impact. One major factor is that the people we serve are poor. Most lack resources to practice any kind of meaningful social

distancing, the vast majority of people cannot afford to stockpile, and many do not have running water in

their homes. Health care services are limited and strained in the best of times. Juxtaposed to this, our small island is also a tourist destination that receives tens of thousands of tourists every month. The local economy depends on tourism, but the island is now hard hit by the impact of tourism during a global pandemic. These factors combine to form a perfect storm, and it has been sobering for us to see the beginnings of Covid-19's impact in our area.

Our initial response was to shelter in place. We pulled our kids out of school to homeschool, shortly after which the local government closed schools nationwide. We practiced social distancing as per the CDC's recommendations, but also because we understand that it is scary to many local people to be around expats right now; there is the view that foreigners are bringing this disease to their country. We can appreciate their fears, as we ourselves have also been shocked that many tourists have still been coming into the area until very recently, some wearing expensive masks they obviously brought from home for their vacation. For people who are poor and vulnerable, this is very frightening. A few of our expat friends who live here have already experienced local people blaming them for the disease; one was called "Corona" while taking the trash out, and an American lady was mobbed while trying to buy vegetables.

When the U.S. Department of State advised American citizens last week to return to America immediately, it made sense to us to do so. We cannot work or study or be with our local friends as usual, and the situation will only deteriorate in the coming weeks. As a family, we have experienced trauma and know its cost, and it seemed wise for us to be cautious at this time and to protect our long-term ministry. For these reasons, and because we have no medical training to assist in the crisis, we decided to pull back and work remotely until the worst of the pandemic is under control. A local family we love moved into our home where they will be much safer, and we made it onto one of the last flights out of our area before the borders closed. We arrived in Atlanta Monday night, thankful and feeling God's presence and care every step of the way. We are now self-quarantined for two weeks in an Airbnb generously made available to us by believers, all four of us feeling healthy but waiting until we are cleared of risk before seeing anyone. After the 14 days, assuming we are fine, we will move in with our parents here in Atlanta. We are deeply thankful to Mom & Dad Harrison for all their loving support and help!

By the grace of God, enough groundwork has been laid with our local partners that a good deal of collaboration can be done remotely, for the time being. As long as they have access to the Internet, we hope to continue creating Scripture Engagement materials such as Scripture songs and story-tellings. We will share more about this in our next update.

In the midst of so much uncertainty, those of us who know Jesus can affirm, "We know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love.... Perfect love drives out all fear." (1 John 4:16,18) The more we can rest in God's love for us, the more we can hear the voice of the One who calls us "beloved," the more we can receive His love into the deepest places of our hearts, the more our lives can be directed by love rather than fear. Our fears loosen their grip on us and instead inform our empathy for others, our dependence on God, and our understanding of His perfect love. All types of mission and neighborly love can flow from this. The center of everything is His love, and the center holds forever.

Thank you for your prayers for us and for the people we love and serve! We are praying for you, too!
